European Parliament draft report on the EU Commission proposal for the recast of the Urban Wastewater Treatment Directive

BACKGROUND

On 26/10/2022, the European Commission released its proposal for the recast of the Urban Wastewater Treatment Directive (UWWTD). The EU's UWWTD currently in force (Council Directive 91/271/EEC) was more than 30 years old. In its proposal, the EU Commission (DG ENV.C.2):

- Extended the obligation to set up urban wastewater collecting systems to all agglomerations with a p.e. of 1.000 or more (article 3)
- Introduced an obligation to achieve energy neutrality for all wastewater treatment plants above 10 000 p.e. by 2040 (article 11).
- Introduced a new article to promote the prevention, re-use and recycling of sludge (article 20).

In the EU Parliament, the recast of the UWWTD was referred to the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety (ENVI). MEP Nils Torvalds (Renew; FI) was appointed rapporteur for this directive and shadow rapporteurs are Deirdre Clune (EPP/IE), Marek Paweł Balt (S&D/PL), Margrete Auken (Greens/DK), Pietro Fiocchi (ECR/IT) and Nikolaj Villumsen (GUE/DK). Jan Huitema (Renew/NL) is rapporteur for opinion in COMAGRI.

On 27/03/2023, MEP Torvalds released its <u>draft report</u> on the EU Commission proposal for the recast of the UWWTD.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR BIOGAS/BIOMETHANE?

The draft report UWWTD covers smaller agglomerations than proposed by the EU Commission i.e. the obligation to set up urban wastewater collecting systems would be extended to all agglomerations with a p.e. of 500 or more (instead of 1000 or more).





Regarding article 11 on energy neutrality which is of strong interest for the biogas/biomethane sector, the rapporteur clarified the means by which energy neutrality can be reached. The draft report indicates in amendment 29 that off-site generation of renewable energy, as well as energy bought from external sources, must be allowed to reach the target, as suggested by EBA secretariat. In amendment 8 to recital 16, the rapporteur specifically acknowledges the standard practice of "sending sludge to a centralised biogas production facility". If this amendment was maintained in the final version of the directive, this would be a positive development for the biogas/biomethane sector and would tackle the main concern that exists on the EU Commission proposal.

The rapporteur did not propose any amendments on article 20 on sludge.

NEXT STEPS

The rapporteur's draft report should be discussed in ENVI Committee on 27/04/2023. The deadline for amendments in ENVI Committee is by 5/05/2023. The draft report will then be further amended and discussed in Plenary. Meanwhile, the Environment Council will adopt its general approach on the EU Commission proposal. Co-legislator will strive to adopt the proposal by the end of the legislature.

EBA Secretariat will continue to monitor this issue.
